

Iberdrola launches the second edition of the Convive Awards

- In the last quarter of the year, the province of Palencia will host the 2nd Convive Awards, which seek to recognise and give visibility to initiatives in Spain that promote renewable energies in harmony with socio-economic and agricultural development and the conservation of biodiversity.
- The awards are organised by Iberdrola, in collaboration with the Centre for Innovation in Technology for Human Development of the Polytechnic University of Madrid ('Centro de Innovación en Tecnología para el Desarrollo Humano de la Universidad Politécnica de Madrid').
- The first edition of the Convive awards, which took place last year at the Palacio de Congresos de Mérida and was attended by the Chairman of Iberdrola, Ignacio Galán, brought together more than 300 people and more than 50 media representatives.

Iberdrola launches the second edition of the Convive Awards together with the Centre for Innovation in Technology for Human Development of the Polytechnic University of Madrid (itdUPM).

These awards recognise and give visibility to initiatives, alliances, companies, actions or local entities that exemplify the integration of <u>renewable energies</u> with socio-economic, rural and agricultural development and the conservation of biodiversity in Spain.

The capital of Palencia was the setting for the presentation of this new call for proposals, which will be open on Iberdrola's website between 3 June and 12 July 2024. The President of the Provincial Council of Palencia, Ángeles Armisén; the Mayor of Paredes de Nava, Luis Antonio Calderón, and the head of Analysis and Special Projects at Iberdrola, Marta Martínez, were responsible for providing the public with all the details of the launch of this second edition of the Convive Awards.

Nominations will be assessed according to four criteria: socio-economic/environmental impact; alignment with the values of the CONVIVE programme in renewables, nature and people; collaboration and alliances between agents and replicability of the initiative/project, and there will be different categories: local entities and citizen participation; innovative solutions and research; social and business entrepreneurship; communication and awareness, and young people.

The winners will receive the relevant distinctions of this second edition of the Convive Awards at a public event to be held in the town of Paredes de Nava in Palencia in the last quarter of the year, and from then on they will become part of the repository of winners, with special recognition and support for the dissemination of their project.

To participate in this second edition of the awards, candidates can download and complete a simple form to describe the initiative and the category for which they are applying.

The independent jury will be composed of up to six members, representing different fields: academic, administrative, environmental, communication, socio-economic or entrepreneurship, among others.
